## **Awards:**

This gives students and parents the opportunity to meet their teacher for the very first time. The students bring their supplies to the classroom, meet their new friends and lower the anxiousness for the first day of school.

### **Book Fair Night– Spring 2019**

### **Parent-Teacher Conferences - 10/29/2018**

Teachers visit with parents of each student to discuss current academic progress. When the teacher and the parent have an opportunity for a one on one conference about the emotional, academic and physical needs of the child, a consistent plan can be implemented for that child. Home-School Compacts and SSI information are discussed and signed by parents.

### **Transitioning to Junior High (TWEENS) –**

The counselor and administration will invite the 5<sup>th</sup> grade parents to visit about what to expect during the transition to Junior High.

### **Communication to Parents**

Campus Site Based Team – Consists of parents that contribute to the team as an advisor to the principal. The focus is student academic achievement noting the importance of the Parent/Student/School Compact.

The PTA Board is another avenue through which communication is provided to parents. The Board also assists in making some campus decisions involving fundraisings, student parties/activities, family involvement activities etc.

There are also monthly newsletters, “Crockett Connection,” to communicate the events and involvement opportunities on campus.

### **Parent Volunteers**

Parents have the opportunity to volunteer in the classroom, school, and on field trips. This creates connections between home and school. The counselor is having informational meeting with parents to raise awareness of needs and get more involvement. ***All parents must pass a criminal background check to be able to participate.***
